Caterpillar Clubhouse is a forward thinking Early Childhood Development Center that promotes optimal development with high-quality care and learning opportunities that help your child receive the best possible start in life. We serve children from birth to age 3.





To best support each child's development, our classrooms utilize Creative Curriculum to guide classroom experiences. Our in-house USDA certified cook makes healthy food from scratch every day to provide the best nutrition for the little ones. Also, once a year we provide free health screenings with licensed professionals to children enrolled in childcare such as hearing, vision and development.

EARLY HEAD START





Early Head Start at Root for Kids serves pregnant women and children from birth to age three in Washington County, Utah. Early Head Start is a comprehensive family development program that promotes the physical, cognitive, social and emotional growth of infants and toddlers to ensure their school readiness. Root for Kids administered 1,612 home visits and 2,463 home visit hours in 21-22. Since the inception of our EHS program, our enrollment has never fallen below 100%. Unfortunately, due to COVID-19 our average percent of funded monthly enrollment was 80%, but is showing signs of returned stability. Root for Kids served 2% of all eligible children (birth to 3) in Washington County.




PROGRAM OUTCOMES








Baby Watch Early Intervention (Utah)



Arizona Early Intervention Program






AGENCY PERFORMANCE

PARENTS AS TEACHERS





Parents as Teachers is an early childhood family support and parent education home-visiting model. Family Support Specialists work with parents to strengthen protective factors and ensure that children birth to 5 years old are healthy, safe, and ready to learn.

We serve children from birth to age five and pregnant women who live in Washington County and along the Arizona strip.

FAMILY SUCCESS STORY



A mom in the program who has 2 kids, one the is 5 and the other one is 2 1/2, was involved with DCFS until today. She has been battling with depression and anxiety, and one day she bit her oldest daughter. That's when DCFS got involved. We have been working with her and DCFS for now about a year and a half. She has come along way, using breathing techniques and knowing when to apply some other methods to help her calm down. Like asking the oldest child why is she behaving badly, why is she crying, and letting her know there is a better way to talk to about her feelings, and that there is a consequence for actions. She has become a wonderful and patient mother. She is always making sure her kids are taken care of. She understands that them being happy allows mom to manage her reactions and manage her depression and anxiety.

Today I was able to go to court with her to hear the good news. They closed the DCFS case, and the judge said nothing but good things about the mom. Also the judge pulled me aside and thank me for going and supporting the family and thanked Root for Kids for the great work that we do with all families in the program.

The Judge said "You being here at court shows how much the program really cares about the families you work with."



VOLUNTEERS

Our Root for Kids volunteers are the backbone of our organization. Young lives are changing in Washington County and along the Arizona Strip because of their commitment, time, and dedication to keeping our mission alive.

We have many ways volunteers can get involved with Root for Kids. We do in-house service projects as well as off-site ones. We also take group and community volunteers of any age. At Root for Kids, we have the option for volunteers to participate in our events such as our annual Glow in the Dark Golf Tournament and Radiothon. The second option is creating interactive learning kits that support the motor and language development of children in our home-visiting programs.







FINANCIAL AUDIT

Root for Kids financial statements were independently audited by Hinton Burdick CPA's and Advisors. Their findings were summarized as follows:
